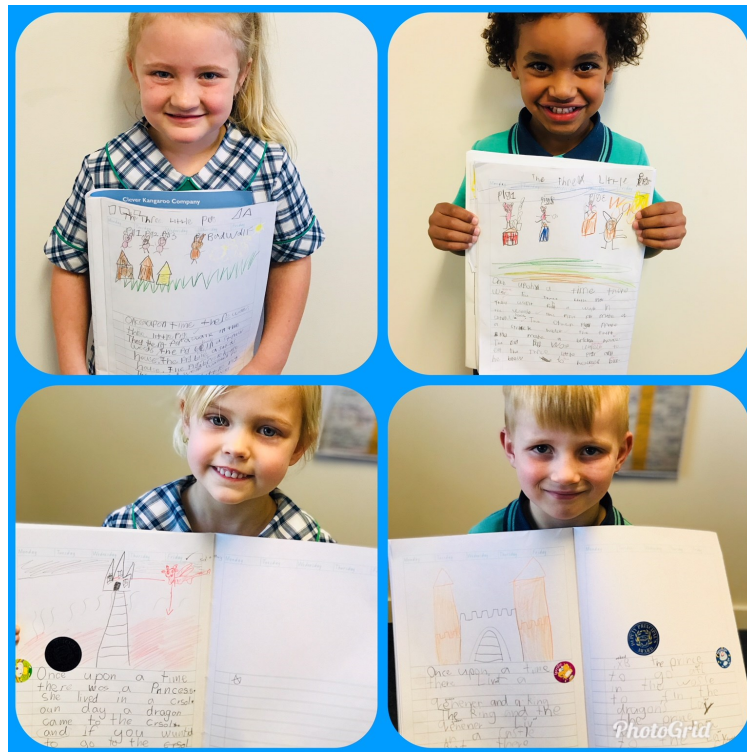

WESTCARE CHRISTMAS APPEAL

The WestCare Christmas Appeal has been running for many years and this Christmas we are again preparing a range of Hampers and gift packs to be given to families and individuals doing it tough at Christmas time. We partner with a range of other community organisations to help reach and distribute hampers to people in homes and situations that we would not otherwise be aware of. In addition to WestCare's Emergency Relief Service, the 2017 Appeal will also impact many financially struggling and often socially isolated community members including:

- * Highest need families as identified by school Principals and key welfare staff in 11 local schools (3 high and 8 primary schools)
- * Domestic Violence surviving mums with children, distributed by both West Connect DV refuge and Penrith Women's Health Centre
- * Men undergoing prostate cancer treatment over Christmas, distributed to selected members by the Nepean Blue Mountains Prostate Cancer Support Group
- * Selected patients in both the Nepean Cancer Care Centre and Palliative Care ward and at the Nepean Hospital, distributed by the hospital's Social Worker team
- * All patients in the Elderly Mental Health ward (lovely older people who are often left alone over Christmas)
- * The Nepean Centre for Addictive Medicine where social workers provide to clients completing programs over Christmas period
- * Ross Hutchison Foundation / Imagine Nations Church referrals / Angels of Mercy refugee services
- * The Nulawala indigenous outreach program
- * Clothing gift packs for Cobham JJC
- * Various toy distribution and other activities

Ideas for donated items

- ⇒ Soft Drinks (1.25litre and 2 litre)
- ⇒ Cordial
- ⇒ Tinned fruit and vegetables
