Principal's Message

DISCO

ASSEMBLIES

Each week we hold school assemblies to recognise our students' achievements through the presentation of awards. Classes also work hard preparing items for these assemblies and look forward to performing in front of their peers,

families and other visitors to our school. We always promote good listening and sensible behaviour at our assemblies with the presentation of star student awards and the shining star draw with an aim to maintaining high standards.

We ask that the parents and visitors assist us in maintaining these high standards at our assemblies by supervising their toddlers and ensuring assemblies are not disrupted. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter as we want assemblies to be pleasant and enjoyable for everyone.

HEAD LICE

Head lice infestations can be unfortunately a common occurrence in schools. Anyone can catch head lice regardless of whether their hair is clean or not. Head lice moves from one person's

head to another via direct contact with the hair and can't survive long when off the human head. They do not live on furniture, hats, bedding or carpet. When an incidence of head lice is reported to us we send home a note to parents requesting that you examine your child's hair and undertake treatment where eggs and lice are identified.

We ask that you please take the time to do this when a note is sent home as untreated head lice impacts on many students and families. 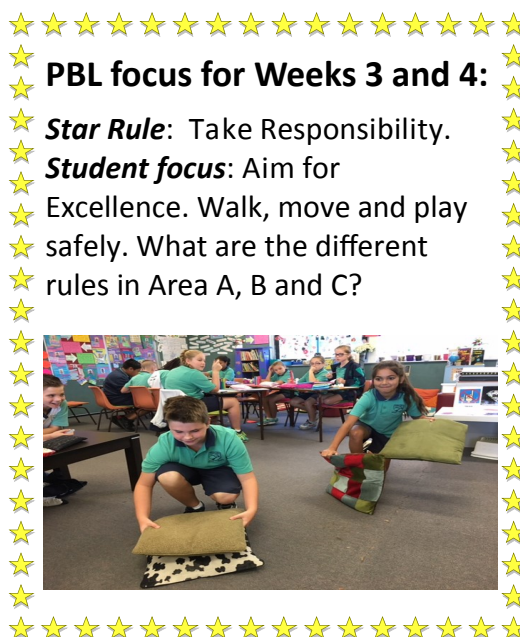
